


ABOUT ADN

ADIS24 AFRICAN DIASPORA INVESTMENT SYMPOSIUM 2024

The African Diaspora Investment Symposium (ADIS) is ADN's annual conference that celebrates and fosters the entrepreneurial and innovative spirit of Africans in the Diaspora and friends of Africa. 2024's Symposium focused on climate change and its effects across a variety of Africa's sectors, highlighting the different innovative solutions being implemented by governments, entrepreneurs and particularly the youth to address these pressing concerns.

Several priority actions came out of the 2.5 days convening including the need to engage and empower local communities, boost green energy initiatives and adapt investment models to local contexts. INNOVATION AND IMPACT FORUMS

Our Innovation and Impact Forums are part of a year-round speaker series across Silicon Valley, Washington, D.C., New York City, and virtually with thought-provoking conversations around strategic and consistent diaspora engagement in Africa's future. This year, we hosted exciting conversations between top academics, business innovators, sport philanthropists and more. Together, we were able to connect, inspire and highlight the power of harnessing the knowledge and resources of Africans in the diaspora for positive impact through investment, entrepreneurship, and innovation.

ACCELERATING BLACK LEADERSHIP AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP

Accelerating Black Leadership and Entrepreneurship (ABLE) is an enterprise accelerator program designed to strengthen, energize, and support impact orientated startups and small businesses led by Black entrepreneurs in the United States. This year's cohort was the largest graduating class so far and featured the largest percentage of women. They represented a diversity of sectors and were all innovating around solutions at the local, national and international level that addressed essential community needs while spurring sustainable growth.








BUILDERS OF AFRICA'S FUTURE

The program identifies African entrepreneurs running early-stage nonprofits or for-profit businesses that address key community needs through technology or differentiated business models. 2024 featured our most diverse range of entrepreneurs both in countries represented and sectors covered.

The Start Your Social Enterprise initiative helps accelerate the entrepreneurial skills of Catholic Sisters who are connected to underserved communities facing poverty and other challenges across the Continent.



YOUNG AFRICAN LEADERS INITIATIVE LEGACY LOCALIZATION

African Diaspora Network is partnering with Arizona State University to implement a USAID \$80 million award to empower Africa's youth through the <u>Young African Leaders Initiative Legacy Localization</u> (YALI LL) Project. YALI LL is working with the Education and Youth division of USAID's Africa Bureau to support the <u>Young African Leaders Initiative</u> (YALI) program with harmonizing recruitment, admissions, curriculum, communications, and increased opportunities for YALI alumni across the continent in an African-led approach. This year, ADN hosted a YALI LL delegation at ADIS24, featuring a few YALI alumni as speakers. We have also been developing a diaspora engagement strategy guide for YALI Africa and have consulted with several diaspora experts and YALI stakeholders in its development.


Our partnership with Leavey has helped us to run ABLE for the past three years and foster innovation and learning for our entrepreneurs. This year we trained our largest class yet.
