



Ages Represented


Collaboration across five generations



Gender Breakdown



PITCH DAY AT BILL HQ

This year's ABLE Pitch Day was held at BILL Headquarters in San Jose, CA. The signature event featured inspiring keynote addresses from René Lacerte, CEO and founder of BILL and Emmanuel Brown, ABLE '22 alum, and Co-founder & COO of ChurchSpace.













The hybrid event brought together venture capitalists, impact investors, and global industry leaders to witness as the entrepreneurs shared their innovation solutions.

Following the pitch presentations, **Joyce Chung, Co-founder and President of Makahakama Foundation** applauded the entrepreneurs on successfully pitching their innovations, and announced a financial award of **\$10,000** for each entrepreneur.

EXPECTATIONS AND OUTCOMES

Overall, the entrepreneurs were pleased with the quality and the authenticity of the ABLE program. The cohort deeply valued the practical and high-impact program content, rich engagement with industry experts, and the actionable insights they gained from the network of facilitators, mentors, and advisors.

At the conclusion of the program, the entrepreneurs identified **attracting investors** and **expanding their social capital**–including engaging with mentors, collaborating with their peers, and connecting with new strategic partners–as their primary expectations for enrolling in the program. At the conclusion of the program, many of the entrepreneurs reported that they believed that they had achieved those outcomes as shown below.



After an extended maternity break, this experience reignited my confidence and reminded me that the work I'm doing through Indeegenus has real value and resonates with investors and potential partners. The exposure and connections gained through ABLE will continue to open doors long after the program ends.
