On April 8, African Diaspora Network, in collaboration with Global Fund for Women, hosted "Paving the Path Forward: Investment in Women," as part of the 2022 Skoll World Forum Ecosystem Day.

Grounding the context of the event in current events, Almaz Negash, Founder and Executive Director of African Diaspora Network, shared her own experiences of growing up in Africa during a period of war and devastation. She referenced the tragedy of Ukraine in witnessing how the devastation of war does not discriminate and has touched on the lives of mothers and children. "With all the challenges, we recognize that there are women, mothers, struggling and suffering in the war we are seeing right now," said Almaz. "As a global citizen, I see this as my problem too."


