


April ADIS22: Energizing Investment in the Solar and Renewable Sector

Private Sector Team Lead, Power Africa



According to a <u>2019 report</u> by the McKinsey Global Institute, women account for more than 50% of Africa's combined population, but generated only 33% of the continent's collective GDP in 2018. These indicators point to stagnation in gender parity in Africa, already behind compared to indicators of gender equality worldwide. Investment in human capital, creation of economic opportunities, and leveraging technology will be key to opening doors to women.

Despite the widening gaps from the pandemic, women have adapted and persevered to support their workplaces, communities, and families. How are women paving the path forward? In what ways are women continuing to make significant strides in the face of challenge? How can we better support women and invest in women-led organizations?
