In turn, residents save hundreds on their electricity bills. Kristal and her team are disrupters who advocate that communities of color and low-income communities be included in this shift and have a healthy environment in the future.

Jody T. Mitchell Founder and CEO, Directed Analytics

Mr. Mitchell is the founder & CEO of <u>Directed Analytics</u> where he has led the development of the company's framework & software, 4SightGPS. Under Mr. Mitchell's leadership, Directed Analytics has accomplished education software, and local government and commercial professional services experience.
