Introducing the African Diaspora Network's partnership in USAID's YALI Legacy Localization activity

The African Diaspora Network is thrilled to announce our partnership with USAID's <u>Young African Leaders Initiative Legacy Localization</u> (YALI LL) activity, led by <u>Arizona State University (ASU)</u>, in conjunction with esteemed consortium partners, <u>FHI 360</u>, <u>CoELIB</u>, and <u>Geek without</u> <u>Frontiers</u>. This alliance marks a pivotal step towards supporting and empowering African stakeholders in establishing an independent YALI Africa organization.

The USAID-funded YALI LL is dedicated to advancing the harmonization efforts of the four existing YALI Regional Leadership Centers (RLCs) in establishing an African-owned, African-led and African-managed YALI Africa that will support the development of the next generation of African leaders.

ADN's pivotal role in YALI LL is the development of a robust African diaspora engagement strategy accompanied by a set of tools designed to catalyze connections between the African diaspora and YALI as investors, mentors, and partners. Our strategy encompasses the recruitment of African diaspora members from within the African continent and around the world, provision of specialized training and workshops for diaspora members committed to connecting with the 27,000+ YALI alumni leaders as mentors, and facilitation of expanded mutually beneficial opportunities and networking. In addition, ADN through YALI LL will deliver tailored coaching and workshops to enhance diaspora engagement best practices for YALI Africa once established and the RLCs.

The ADIS24 'African Youth Taking Global Climate Action' panel

African youth play a significant role in the fight against the global climate crisis. A <u>study</u> by the Ichikowitz Family Foundation revealed that more than % of African youth advocate for more decisive policy measures to address climate change. That is why this year's ADIS24 has curated a youth-led panel discussion on African youth's role in the fight against the global climate crisis. The panel consists of young African changemakers taking lead in climate action activism and innovative solutions to combat the climate change crisis.

The panel will include two accomplished YALI alumni climate leaders. This panel will explore what specific grassroot actions African youth have undertaken to combat the global climate crisis and how other regions can learn from this experience.

This panel reflects the dedication and involvement of ADN in supporting African Youth Leaders and ensuring that youth voices are not only represented but centered in decision making when it comes to the future of Africa and the world.

Edward is a Mastercard Foundation Scholar at UC Berkeley




Triomphant Tchulang Kouogue


