Reflecting on ADN's Women's International Day Event



On a vibrant day this March, the African Diaspora Network (ADN) hosted a transformative Women's International Day event. This virtual gathering connected voices from across the globe, focusing on unleashing the power of women in driving economic, political, and social spheres.

The event spotlighted the urgent need to invest in women entrepreneurs in Africa. Keynote speakers, including Pauline Kerbel of Shih FBT and Tochi Gini-Gemi of Mesh, shared insightful data and personal experiences. They illuminated the staggering \$42 billion gender funding gap in Africa and the critical role diaspora remittances play in bridging this divide.
